Torajan means Toraja people

Tomembali Puang (spirits of the ancestors who have transformed into gods)

Rambu Tuka ' *Torajan* life (thanksgiving) ceremony

Rambu Solo ' *Torajan* death ceremony

Puya this is the afterlife for the Toraja people. This afterlife can also be called the temporary cessation of the spirit before tuning to the sky and becoming a god.

Tongkonan Toraja traditional house, symbol of fellowship

Longko ' Toraja culture of shame, which means preventive shame

aluk means religion, namely devotion to the deity or gods, it performs in traditional way of life or in religious ritual or customs ceremonies, behavior.

The Indonesian-Toraja dictionary defines *pemali* as *taboos*, and prohibitions
